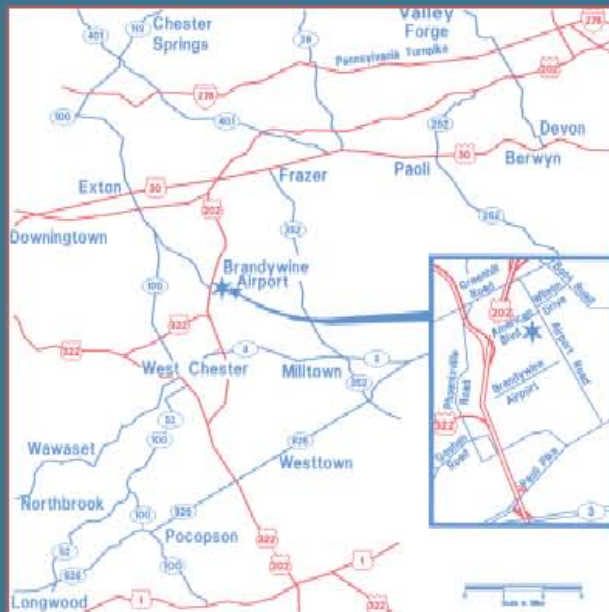
A great place for families, kids can climb aboard helicopters of all kinds for a truly unique hands-on experience.

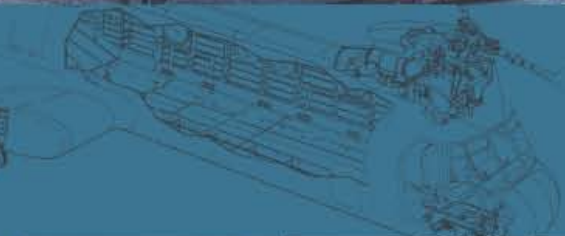
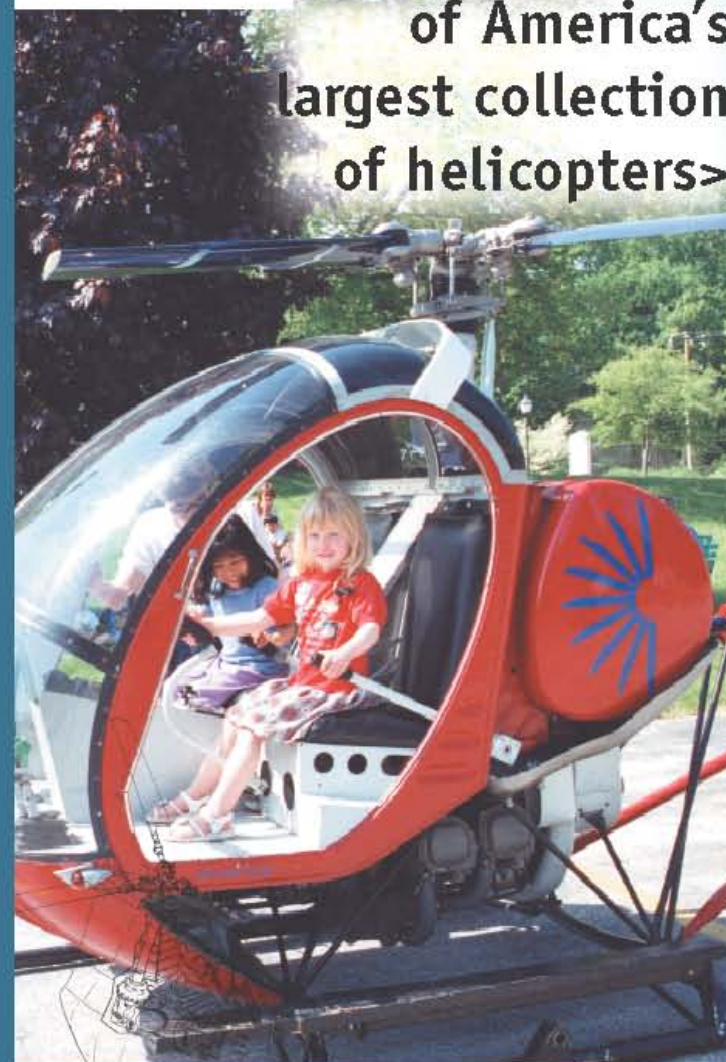

>The American Helicopter Museum and Education Center preserves, for public enjoyment and education, the origins and history of rotary wing aircraft in the United States.

We are the only museum in America to focus exclusively on the unique science and technology of rotary wing aviation.

The Museum features many of the earliest rotary aircraft including the prototype for the first mass-produced helicopter and the second successful helicopter to fly in the United States.

>We also feature the only V-22 tilt-rotor Osprey on public display, as well as a number of experimental aircraft.

Two of today's three major helicopter manufacturers trace their roots to the greater Philadelphia area.

Appropriately, the Museum is located in suburban Philadelphia, where much of the earliest development of helicopters in the United States was centered.

>With its continually growing collection of documents, artifacts, films, and memoirs, the Museum's research library serves the nation as its single public source of rotary wing information.
