Location: Just a short walk from Independence National Historical Park, The Liberty Bell and Independence Hall, Independence Seaport Museum is situated in the heart of the Penn's Landing Waterfront. Easily accessible by car, bus or rail. Also, the RiverLink ferry and Philadelphia Trolley Works trolleys make passenger stops just outside the Museum's doors.

By Car: From I-95 North or South, take Exit 20 – Columbus Boulevard/Washington Avenue. Turn left onto Columbus Boulevard. Turn right under the Walnut Street Pedestrian Bridge. From the Schuylkill Expressway (76) take the Vine Street Expressway (676) to I-95 and follow directions above.

Parking: The Penn's Landing Waterfront offers public parking. Additional lots are located at nearby Pier 30 and across the pedestrian bridges in the Olde City and South Street areas.
