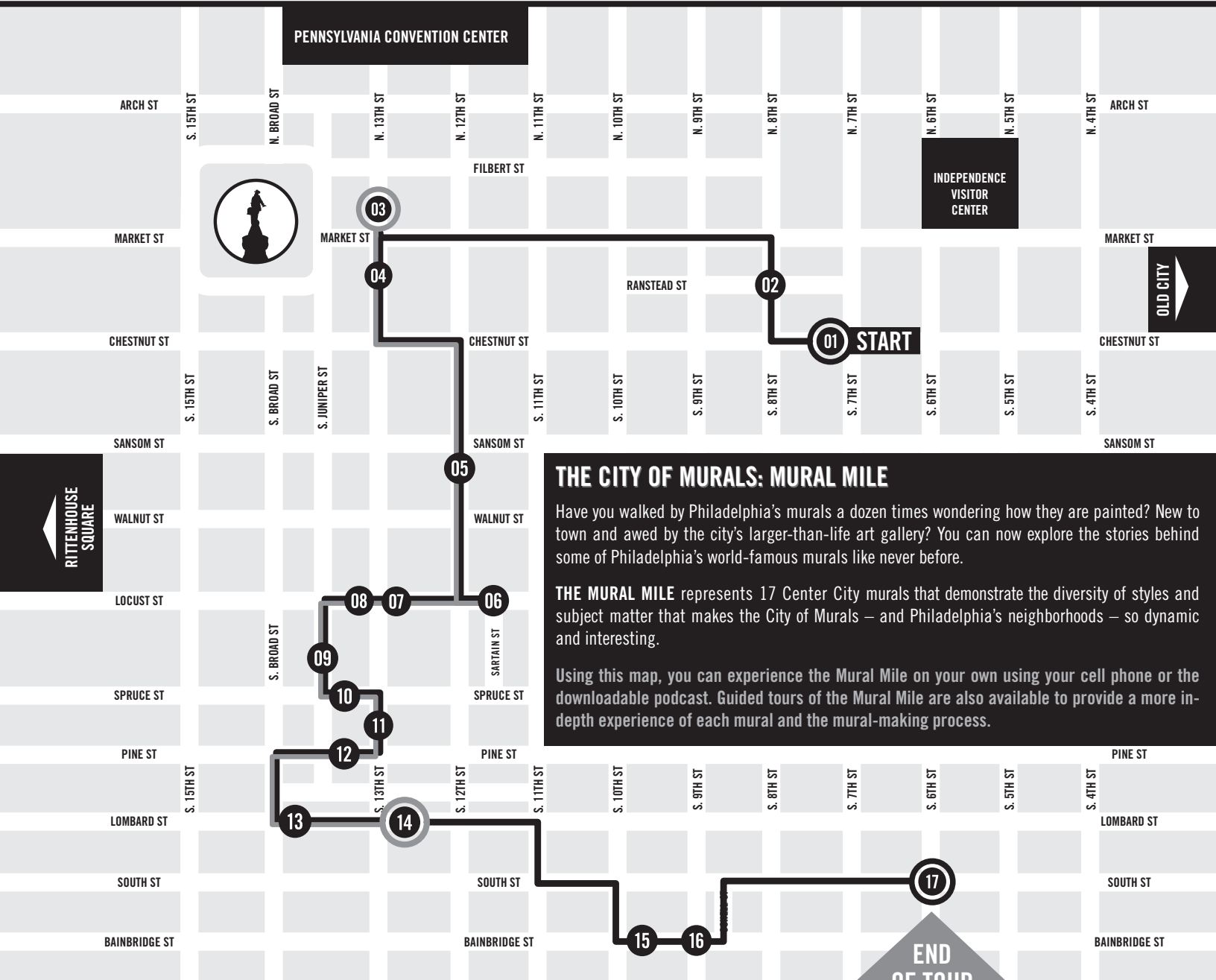

For the full version of the walking tour, begin at mural number 01, *Legacy*, at 707 Chestnut Street.

For the abridged version of the tour, begin at mural 03, *Tree of Knowledge*, at 13th and Market Streets and end at mural 14, *Gimme Shelter*, at 1235 Lombard Street.



THE CITY OF MURALS: MURAL MILE

Have you walked by Philadelphia's murals a dozen times wondering how they are painted? New to town and awed by the city's larger-than-life art gallery? You can now explore the stories behind some of Philadelphia's world-famous murals like never before.

THE MURAL MILE represents 17 Center City murals that demonstrate the diversity of styles and subject matter that makes the City of Murals – and Philadelphia's neighborhoods – so dynamic and interesting.

Using this map, you can experience the Mural Mile on your own using your cell phone or the downloadable podcast. Guided tours of the Mural Mile are also available to provide a more in-depth experience of each mural and the mural-making process.

To return to the Independence Visitor Center, turn left onto 6th Street and continue to Market Street.

Head west on Chestnut Street towards 8th Street. Turn right onto 8th, continue one block to Ranstead Street. Mural on right.

Continue on 8th Street to Market Street and turn left. Continue past 13th Street. Mural on right.

Return to 13th Street and turn right. Continue half a block. Mural on left facing the church at Ludlow Street (the narrow alley before the church).

Continue south on 13th Street. Turn left onto Chestnut Street, turn right onto 12th, and cross Sansom Street. Mural on left.

Continue south on 12th Street. Cross Locust Street to south side and turn left onto Locust. Continue half a block. Mural on right at Sartain Street.

Continue on Pine Street, turn left onto Broad and go one block.
Mural on left at Lombard Street.

Continue on Lombard Street, turn right onto 11th, and turn left onto South.
Turn right onto 10th and turn left onto Bainbridge. Mural on left.
